




Seeds that Grow: 1


Also in that year, Portals of Prayer devotional began publi-

Two years ago, Mrs. Carol Frey, (now retired) principal of Concordia Prep Middle School, and her students had a goal -- to help homeless veterans. So began the labor of love.

Recently, Carol delivered five mats to LMS Compassion Place headquarters crocheted with plarn (plastic yarn made from supermarket bags). The mats -- to be given to homeless clients, particluarly veterans -- are weather-proof, very durable, lightweight, transportable, and even provide some cushioning.

"Each mat takes 5-6 months of 2+ hours of crocheting per day to finish," said Carol. "We use about 225 plastic bags for each one."

Carol includes a note with every mat with simple instructions and a prayer for each recipient.
