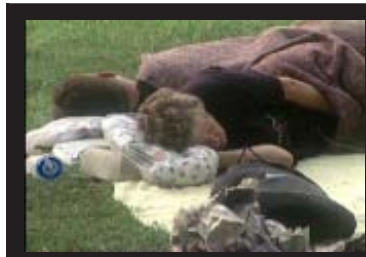

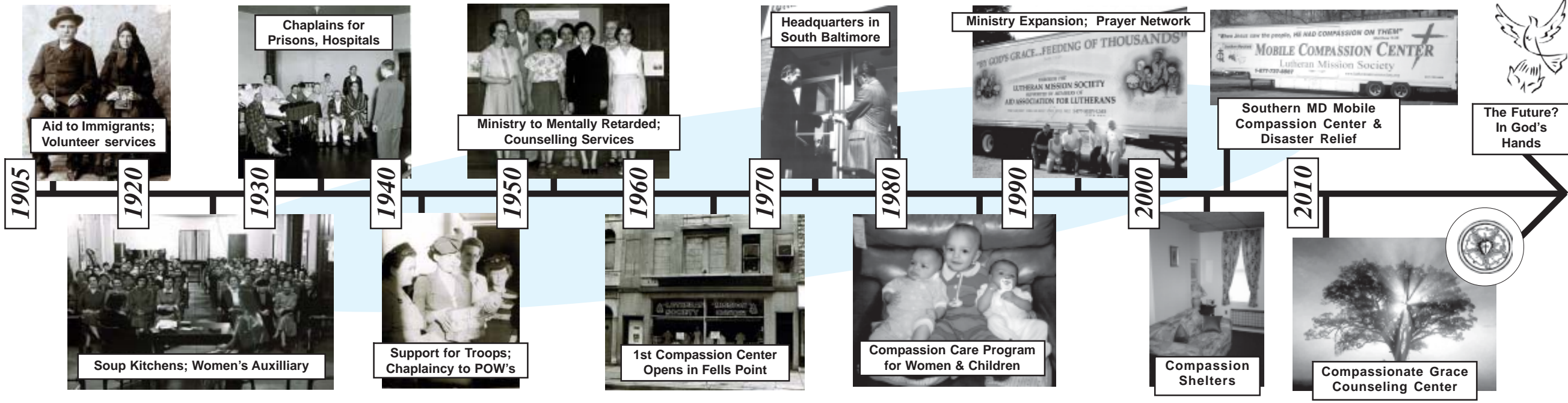


The Lutheran Mission Society is a Jesus place, first and foremost. Our vision statement:

Ministries of the Lutheran Mission Society

The **Lutheran Mission Society**, established in 1905, is a Christian Health & Welfare organization with eight **Compassion Centers** – seven in Maryland and one in York, Pennsylvania. The Lutheran Mission Society's Compassion Centers serve over 500 walk-in clients per day – providing food, clothing, health services, disaster relief, chaplaincy, and Christian counseling.

LMS Compassion Shelters offer efficiency apartments to church workers and low-income families. The program has locations in Annapolis, MD and York, PA.

Compassionate Grace Counseling Center is a faith-based counseling program whose purpose is to provide low-to-no cost counseling to the community. Called to purpose in 2010, the Compassionate Grace Counseling Center operates under a need-based sliding fee.

LPDR (Lutheran Partners in Disaster Response) is a cooperative ministry among the Southeastern District, LCMS; Delaware Maryland Synod, ELCA; Diakon Lutheran Social Ministries; and the Lutheran Mission Society. LPDR provides long-term disaster support in Maryland and Delaware.
